Invisible Homelessness - Quick Facts (2025)

The Reality



- Over 70% of families experiencing homelessness are hidden, staying in motels, cars, or doubled-up housing.
- Family homelessness rose 39% nationally from 2023 to 2024.
- Nearly 150,000 children experienced homelessness during the 2024 count.

Why Families Stay Hidden

- Fear of child-welfare involvement or stigma.
- Eligibility rules that require families to "prove suffering" to access help.
- Safety concerns in shelters or fear of retraumatization.

Invisibility is an adaptive survival strategy — but it comes at a deep emotional cost.

Consequences of Invisibility



Families lose access to services when HUD definitions exclude them.



Children experience higher developmental risks.



Systems overspend on crisis instead of prevention.

What Helps

- 1. Expand definitions of homelessness to include all unstably housed families.
- 2. Invest in trauma-responsive early learning and guaranteed income.
- 3. Build prevention systems, not crisis-only responses.
- 4. Center lived experience in policy design.
